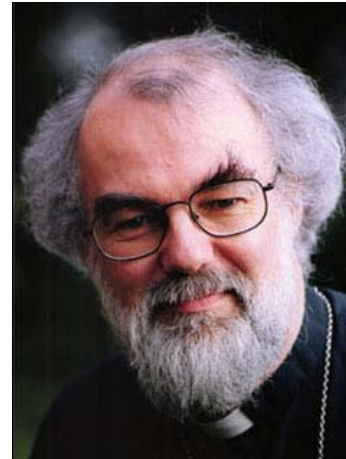


# Christianity: Public Religion & the Common Good

How are religions contributing to society today? What roles do they play? With special reference to Christianity, Rowan Williams will speak on the place of religions in providing stability, a long-term vision, a deeper perspective of humanity and the common good we all share.

Rowan Douglas Williams is the 104th and current Archbishop of Canterbury. Prior to his present appointment, Dr. Williams served as Archbishop of Wales, Bishop of Monmouth and Professor of Theology at Oxford. He is a distinguished theologian, poet and linguist. He has written a number of books on the history of theology and spirituality and published collections of articles and sermons - as well as two books of poetry. He has been involved in various commissions on theology and theological education. Dr Williams is also a Fellow of the British Academy.
